Garretts Green Nursery School

Dear Parents, May 2017

It's hard to believe that there is little more than one half term to go before most of your children leave us to transfer to primary school. The year has flown by and the children have been a joy to teach but we still have so much to fit in to the last weeks!

You will now have had confirmation about the school allocated for your child for September 2017. We are not provided with details directly so, if you haven't already told us which school you have been allocated please would you confirm this to your child's key worker. Thank you.

You will need to confirm directly with that school that you require the place, It is important that you make contact to confirm that you are accepting the place. Most schools are over-subscribed and re-allocate unwanted places to the next child on the waiting list.

We will shortly begin to work on transition with the children. The primary schools usually have their own transition arrangements and you will be invited to the new school for meetings but we also start work around the move to different schools so that the children are fully prepared. If you have any concerns about this please don't hesitate to speak to a member of staff.

Thank you to all the parents of the children who have just joined us. They are enjoying the experiences and have settled well thanks to the way you have prepared them. I am sure that they will continue to enjoy the Summer Term and return in September for the full school year.

End of Year Transfer Documents and Parents' Consultations

Our Parent's Consultations before Easter were well-attended, both during the daytime sessions and in the evening and it was lovely to see so many of you in school to discuss your child's progress.

During the second half of the Summer Term we will be completing an end of year Transfer Document or school report. These documents are very detailed and we generally do not offer a Parents' Consultation unless you feel that the report does not offer enough information. In that case you would be able to make an appointment with your child's Key Worker.

However, for the children who have only just started at Garretts Green Nursery School, the Transfer Document will be very brief and if you would like to speak to a member of staff about your child's progress we will offer some possible dates later in the term.

30 Hours Funded Childcare

Our September 2017 offer is likely to be different to previous arrangements due to the changes in Government funding arrangements.

If you are a parent of a child who started here after Easter and who will be returning in September, please may I ask you to return your documentation to us as soon as possible so that places may be confirmed.

The new arrangements are explained fully in the letters we sent to you but if you need any further advice please don't hesitate to ask.

Parents' Questionnaires

Thank you for completing our Parents' Questionnaire. We had 37 responses and the comments have mostly been extremely positive. I can't thank you enough for your overwhelming support for the school and feel very privileged to have had that support!

We always analyse the responses and report to the school's Governing Body. The last Governors' Meeting was just before the Easter break and I gave a brief summary of the responses at that time. There is a copy of the report attached.

An issue which was raised by one parent was that some aspects of our website are not up to date. This has been a concern for us, too. The majority of the information is current but we had not realised that when the new dates for the diary were posted the old dates had remained elsewhere on the site as an events calendar. Obviously, this could cause some confusion and is being corrected.

It may be useful to highlight that Emma writes a weekly blog about what the children have done in school. These blogs usually have a photograph attached and you may see your child there if you have agreed to their photographs being used. Emma now also emails parents when their child's photograph is shown. This is a good starting point for discussing activities with your child, especially if he or she tells you very little!

If you haven't already done so, please take a few minutes to look at the blogs. Some of you have added a comment about the children's work or about an event and we are very grateful for those positive comments. Thank you.

We do not employ a technician to make changes to our website and some changes can only be made by the host company. Staff have a full timetable with the children and making the changes, blogging or contacting the web hosts are tasks that are always completed in our own time so please be patient with us.

During the Summer we also begin to offer events for the new cohort, as you know. School will be closed on **Friday 9th June** for the new Intake Play Sessions. Staff will also be carrying out home visits. Punctuality

Please remember that our morning start time is 8.25am and our afternoon session starts at 12.25pm Monday to Thursday. Friday morning sessions end at 11.05 am and afternoons begin at 12.55pm. Please arrive promptly to avoid your child missing the valuable start to the session.

Naming clothes

Please ensure that your child's clothing is named. As the weather gets warmer, the children often take off jumpers or cardigans and they all look identical. Please write your child's name on the label. If your child has a hat, which we advise you to provide, the hat should also be named please.

Sun cream

Please apply sun cream to your child before arriving at Nursery. We are happy to help your child re-apply cream later in the session with your permission. If you would like us to do so, please speak to your child's key worker. You would need to bring a named bottle of cream/lotion to school. Thank you.
