Future of Nursery Schools

You may have seen recent news coverage of the challenges to Nursery School funding. Across the country, the financial pressures on this high quality educational provision are enormous and, as a result of dwindling budgets, over 200 Nursery Schools have closed over recent years.

I have attended meetings in London with Claire, our Assistant Headteacher, to campaign through an All Party Parliamentary Group (APPG) for appropriate levels of funding for our schools before the provision and the expertise is lost.

Recently, the APPG has managed to ensure a less fragile future for us for the next two years but after that the future is less certain.

You will, I am sure, understand how important this is to us. We have worked tirelessly over a number of years to become a fully inclusive school which caters for the individual needs of every child. We hope that the start to school life is a positive experience for every child in our care and that we secure positive outcomes from an early age. We can't imagine a future when we are unable to provide for local children and their families.

If there is any opportunity for parents to contribute to the campaign we would like to invite you to be involved and will share any details with you over time.

In the meantime, we will continue to fight for funding that provides a more secure future for Nursery School provision.
