

Autumn term 1



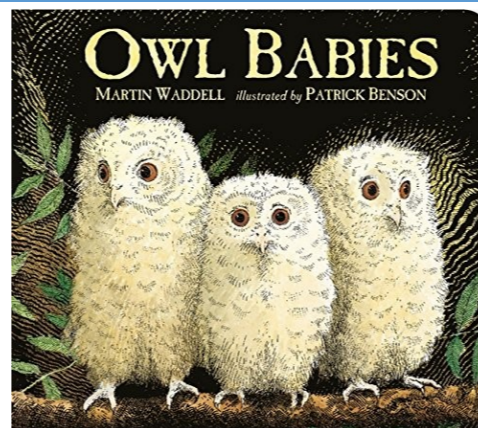
Children settling into nursery; understanding there are similarities and differences in families compared to our own; diversity;

Autumn term1



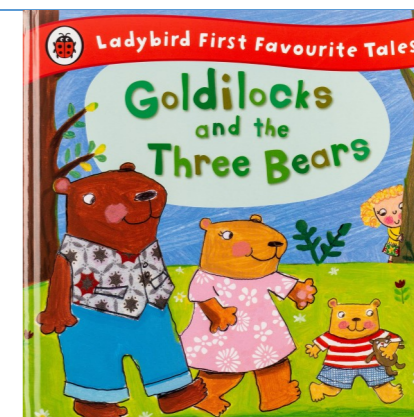
Deals with separation; emotions such as fear/anxiety; repetition of language; children can relate to having older and younger siblings; memory skills

Autumn term 1



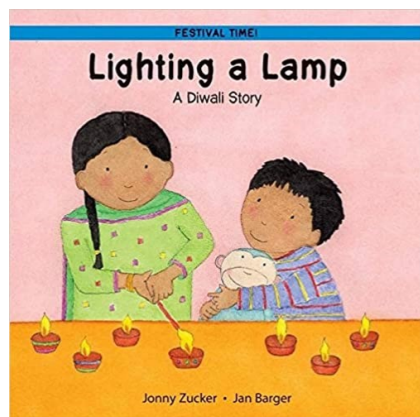
Number; vocabulary related to size; repetition of words; journey; memory; feelings; moral—how your actions might hurt others;

Autumn term 2



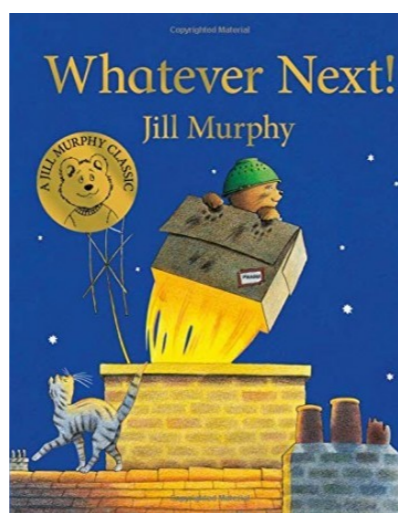

Autumn term 2



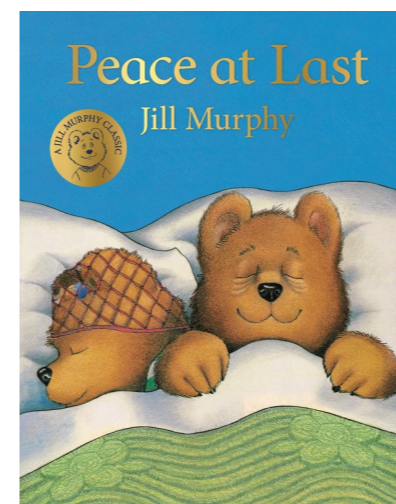
Continuation about light/dark; imagination; going on a journey; sequencing;

Maths focus: Measure; Recalls a sequence of events in everyday life and stories **Pattern** Is interested in what happens next using the pattern of everyday routines

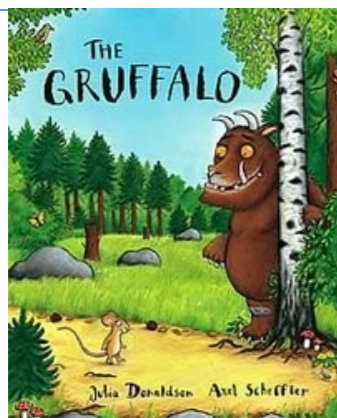
Imagination; creativity; different places and environments; Christmas; rhythm and rhyme; weather

Spring term 1



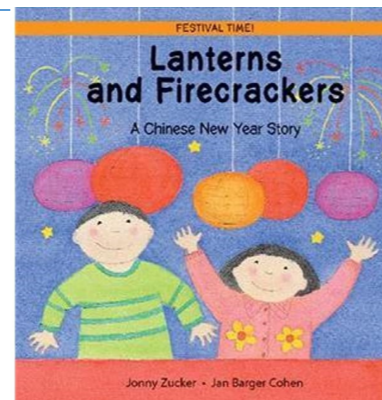
Sense of imagination; ; animal habitats; memory; descriptive language

Spring term1



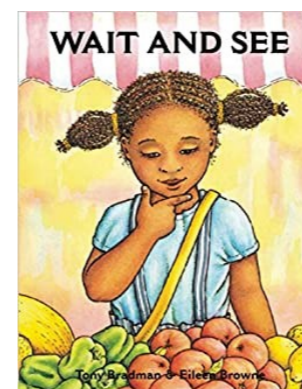
How families and children celebrate Chinese New Year; simple images to illustrate events.

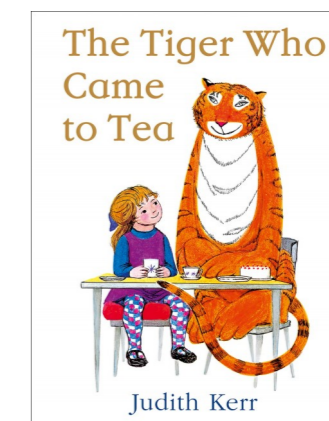
Diversity; stereotypes; names of different food shops; understanding money; community; healthy foods

Spring term 1



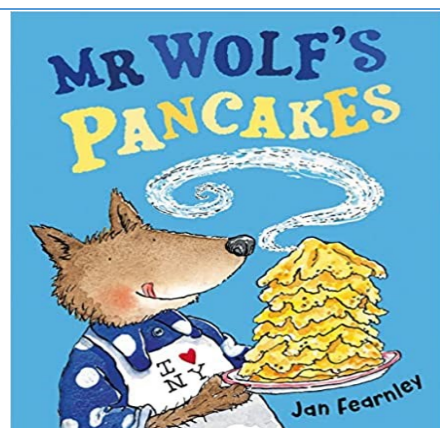
Stranger danger; sharing; imagination; food; places we eat; feelings

Spring term 2



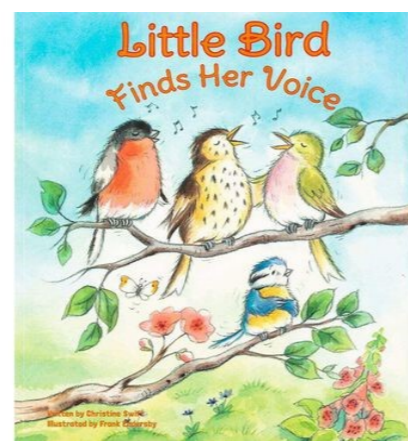
As tory about working hard even when no one can help; friendships; helping other people; repetition; farm animals; process of making bread; planting and growing

Spring term 2



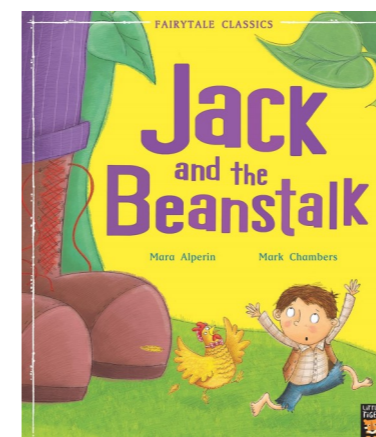
A story about persevering and simply having a go as you never know what might happen.

Spring term 2



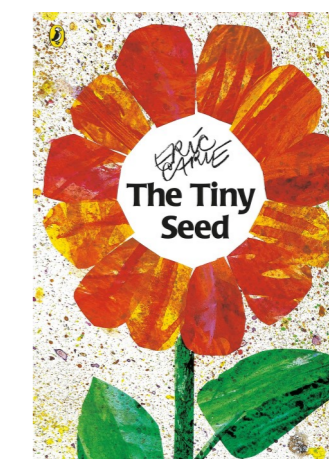
Imagination; sounds; morals; rhythm and rhyme; planting and growth;

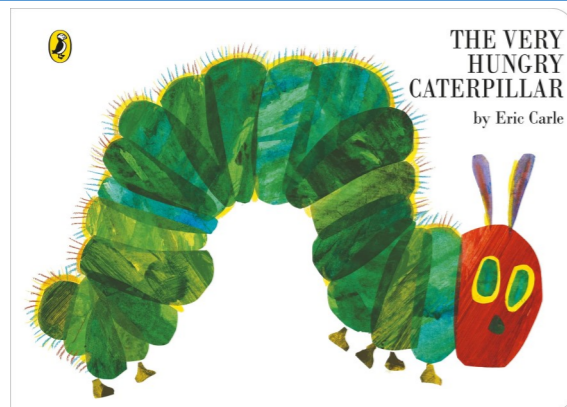
Seasons; growth,; Life cycle; weather ; nature;

Summer term 1



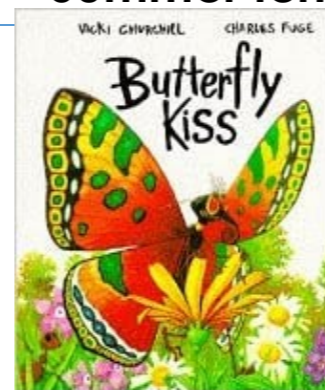
Sequencing; days of the week; maths; healthy and non healthy food; growth cycle of a caterpillar; pattern;

Summer term 1



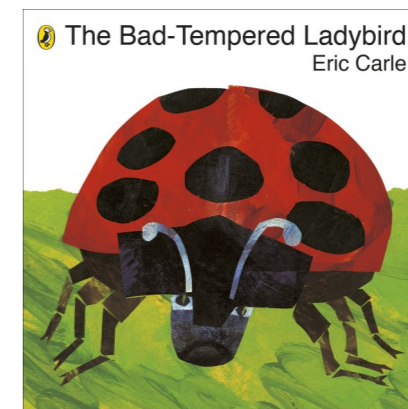
Growth; change; names and characteristics of different insects and creatures

Summer term 1



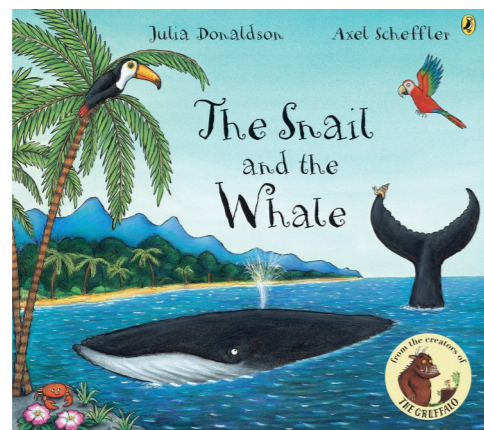
Feelings/emotions; how to deal with conflict; time; names of insects and creatures;

Summer term 2



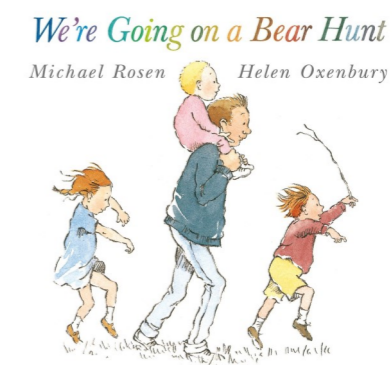
PSED 2 best friends who move away from each other, but still remain friends even though they don't see each other every day!
