Have you heard about....?

FGM

Female genital mutilation is considered culturally acceptable in some communities. In the United Kingdom this practice is illegal and any person found responsible for any involvement in arranging or carrying out the practice is likely to be imprisoned.

The practice is medically unnecessary and is likely to result in extreme pain, medical complications and in on-going health concerns for those who undergo the procedure.

Should you have a concern that a child has undergone or is likely to undergo this procedure please share your concerns with the police or the CASS team immediately.

PREVENT

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As you are aware, there have been well-publicised issues associated with extremism in a tiny minority of our schools in Birmingham. For a number of years Birmingham City Council has worked to ensure that children are safe from harm and that extremist views are not tolerated in schools. There have been a number of briefings for staff and training has been provided for staff and governors. This has resulted in a raised awareness of the forms that extremism may present itself. Our role in preventing this is through raising self-esteem and self-confidence to ensure that young people feel strong and empowered to stand up for themselves. Our curriculum also focuses on rules and understanding right and wrong and on tolerance. This is taught at an appropriate level for young children and we use stories and puppets to gain children's interest and develop understanding.

'PANTS' The Underwear Rule

Have you heard about.....?

Some conversations between parents and young children may be quite difficult . How do you tell a child about sexual abuse without alarming them or without giving them information that you may feel they are too young to know?

NSPCC have produced a booklet, **'PANTS'**, which we recommend should you have concerns about ensuring your children know how to keep safe. The booklet explores the issues in a way that children understand and which is not embarrassing.

'PANTS' has been sent home previously but should you require other copies they are available in our main corridor and at the office.
